We celebrated our successful Women In Technology program with the graduation of our second group of women, armed with skills and training to enter the IT industry. We continued with our brand refresh and in November, we will publicly launch this new brand with the goal of increasing awareness of Making Changes Association – so stay tuned! We improved our system of client contact by introducing a software that allowed us to do online appointment booking, send reminder text messages to our clients and track some of our data easier and faster. We also held an Agency Open House, where we met many of our 100+ referral and community partners and updated them on our programs and services, so we can all support our women and girls together.

As we head into our exciting next year, we will continue to offer our dedication to support the goal, vision and mission that allows us to make positive change in the lives of women and girls to support them in their pursuit of meaningful work and empower them to live their best lives.






Revenue: \$1,013,670

THE WALK-IN CLOSET

The Walk-In Closet provides 90-minute individual consultations on professional business attire to women facing financial barriers who want to join the work force, return to school or engage in volunteer opportunities. In addition to information on business culture and appropriate dress, participants are offered gently used clothing and accessories at no cost to help them look and feel their best.

Our volunteer Image Consultants focus on boosting the self-confidence of our participants by making them feel accepted and inspired to bravely take the next step in their journey. It's truly rewarding to see these women stand a bit taller and smile brighter! 27,056

MY BEST FREIND'S CLOSET

My Best Friend's Closet is a youth engagement and empowerment program that provides teenage girls from low-income households with clothing and accessories to meet their school and recreational needs for the upcoming year, all at no cost to their families. The girls spend 90 minutes with a volunteer stylist, choosing their clothes and accessories and talking about school, recreational activities, fashion trends and making new connections! They walk away with confidence, a sense of belonging and motivation to attend school.

The program also provides valuable leadership and personal development opportunities to young women in the community who volunteer and act as near-peers to the girls they support in our program.

The Employment and Life Skills Program is designed to provide immigrant women with preemployment preparation and support. Creating an awareness of the Canadian workplace culture and evaluating their personal strengths, the program helps participants build employment skills and establish their career path as they seek to become active members of the community through employment and volunteer opportunities.

WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY

Making Changes has continued offering our unique program aimed at supporting women to gain employment in the ever changing IT field. We had our second successful graduation of 14 excited and skilled participants. Our program offers women an integrated skills training program over 26 weeks which combines employability skills upgrading, technical training (through the CISCO Network Academy) and hands-on work experience.

The work experience placements were provided to the women at a variety of small to large local employers and in addition to being a hands on learning opportunity, it also gave employers a chance to "test drive" potential new employees. This program will continue to develop and evolve in the coming years based on industry assessments of the most sought after skills. We are the only program offering this training with a women-centric approach.
